

Connected Curriculum

To link with our science work on the solar system, in the connected curriculum this term, children will be learning about the ancient Sumerian civilisation, who developed the use of 60 minutes as a unit of time and the impact they had on the world with inventions and technologies.

Science

In Science this term, children will be learning about the earth and other planets, understanding how day and night are formed and describing the movement of the moon. They will also investigate light and shadows.

English

In English, children will continue to develop their sentence writing skills using a text based on space and they will be writing formal letters, understanding the skills needed to write appropriately in a formal style. They will continue to practise handwriting and read together as a whole class to develop reading skills.

Children will learn about the values of truthfulness and dignity this term, also considering answers to the question "What does it mean if God is holy and loving?"

Maths

In Maths, children will cover a range of topics including fractions, ratio, area, decimals and percentages, area, perimeter and volume, and statistics. They will also have opportunities for careful problem solving and reasoning.

PSHE/ Citizenship

Design Technology/Art

The children will be using a variety of media this term, to create their own imaginative alien. The children will also be creating a drawing of a planet and creating an environment for the alien.
